Last Shook Descendant Dead

Alfred Montgomery Shook, a native of Tracy City, whose father contributed the funds for the erection of James K. Shook School in Tracy City, died Wednesday of last week in Birmingham, Ala. He was 92 years old.

He was born in the old Col. A.M. Shook home in Tracy, now the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Charles M. Boyd. His father was a leading executive of Tracy City firm which was precursor of the present Tennessee Coal and Iron Division of U.S. Steel in Birmingham.

A graduate of Hotchkiss School in Lakeville, Conn., and Yale University, Class of 1905, Mr. Shook compiled an enviable record of business and civic accomplishments.

He was past president of the Dixie Brass and Foundry Company, secretary of the National Pipe and Foundry Company in Atalla, Ala., and president of the People's Finance and Thrift Company.

He was also a director at Traders National Bank, American Trust and Savings Bank, First National Bank, Woodlawn Savings Bank, and Epp's Cotton Gin.

He was a member of the Downtown Club, The club, the Relay House, and the Mountain Brook Club. He also served as director of the Rotary Club and was president of the Yale, Harvard and Princeton Club.

Active at Independent Presbyterian Church, Mr. Shook was a trustee, elder and past president of the congregation. In addition, he served on the Men's Club and the Fresh Air Farm and was treasurer of the Bible Society.

Mr. Shook was chairman of the second Community Chest drive on the board of the Salvation Army and Arlington. He served as vice president and treasurer of Birmingham's first Civic Symphony Orchestra and was director of the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce and the Alabama Automobile Association.

Alan Melvin Shook 75, of Tracy City died at Cumberland Heights Hospital early Saturday morning following a heart attack.

Mr. Shook was born in Paduach, KY, Oct 13, 1894, the eldest son of Joseph and Margaret Reid Shook, a pioneer family in the cultural, religious, and social development of Tracy City.

Mr. Shook was a retired N.C. & St. L. railroad engineer, a past master of Sewanee Lodge F&AM 405, from which he received a 50-year pin, past worthy patron of the Order of Eastern Star 26, and a member of Grundy County Court, representing the 5th Civil District.
